Grace and Peace Beloved of God,

I pray that all is well with your soul. There is much to be thankful for. We are a congregation of Christ. We have the awesome mission to share the Good News, promote salvation and new life in Christ, and act with compassion. As followers of Jesus, we are charged to pray for peace and unity in the Holy Spirit. Live free and take comfort knowing that Christ has overcome the world (John 16:33).

Our world needs revival and prayer. Our nation needs peace. The escalation of violence and hate speech that grips our communities and harms our people is draining life and joy out of moms, dads, sons, and daughters. Consider compassion and longsuffering when talking or listening to a friend, stranger, or family member who thinks differently than you, or holds beliefs that do not match yours. Now is the time for positive social interaction, such as being on social media, making phone calls, sending emails, or talking face-to-face. Consider

praying that your understanding and compassion and theirs are stretched and strengthened for the glory of God.

Our nation needs a light to guide us in this divisive and violent time. Let us come together, let us speak with one another with peace not hostility; let us find common ground, and demonstrate the love and grace that God grants each of us. As we learn from Ephesians 4:2-3, "With all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace," let our neighbors experience through us peacemaking, bridgebuilding, and prayers so that healing, civility, and peace may repair the deep fractures of our nation.
