Grace and Peace Beloved of God,

As children return to preschool, churches gear up for rally day, and the fall sports programs and classes begin, let us remember that each day is a new beginning and that in Christ we are alive! Remembering that our identity is first as a child of God, made wonderfully and lovingly in God's image will help us be the joy and light so needed in our communities.

In chapter 17 of the Gospel of John, Jesus declares that we belong to Him and prays that we might have His joy fulfilled within us. Jesus prays that we may all become one just as the Father in heaven and Jesus are one. Jesus is ever caring for our well-being. He knows that so many of us are stressed and troubled by fear. Though these times may feel uncertain, know that God is in control and is still speaking.

There is much pain and suffering in our world. Intolerance and rejection of others perceived as not holding the same values, beliefs, or opinions burden many hearts. Yet, we who follow Christ are called to serve our families and communities as ambassadors of hope. In Christ, we can act with compassion in response to corruption, idolatry, and hatred. We can remind one another that all souls belong to God and we each are made in God's image.

We find an example of being claimed by God in the Bible text of 1 Samuel. God reveals a call story for our learning. Young Samuel, who is studying to become a priest, hears God's call and replies, "Speak, LORD, for Your servant is listening." God showed Samuel a vision of things to come, and Samuel walked after God, grew in wisdom, and became a great leader who led Israel from tribal disunity to national solidarity and established the monarchy with Saul as their first

king. A key lesson is that God desires to be in fellowship with us.

Fellowship, with God at the center, can help us to model forgiveness and community, and help us develop spiritual gifts such as leadership, hospitality, wisdom, stewardship, and listening, for God is still speaking. Fellowship is a theme we will explore within our Sunday School exploration of Noah's Ark. Just as God instructed Noah to gather two of every kind of living creature and bring them into the ark, we renew the invitation for you to bring into the church every gift, no matter how great or small.

Come and fill Dryland with your presence, prayers, praise, song, and talents. Come and let us discern together the ways we will help our community as builders and peacemakers. Let the Holy Spirit move through you so that our neighbors and families can experience anew God's beloved community at Dryland.

Sharing, for all to know – The consistory and finance committee were recently provided an update on the three items as listed below. The items are related to the parking lot enhancements and sanctuary air conditioning outage.

- 1. Parking Lot Resurfacing & Lining Status is complete. Receipts were \$13,765.43, Expenses \$12,910.00. Remaining balance \$855.43
- 2. Parking Lot Lights Status is complete. Receipts were \$ 4,063.15, Expenses \$1,390.00. Remaining balance \$ 2,673.15

The balance remaining for these two items is \$3,528.58.

3. Sanctuary Air Conditioning – two units service the entire sanctuary. They are identified as the East Side and West Side.

Both were originally installed 30 years ago.

- a. West Side Entire unit replaced in 2018. Several key components recently failed that caused the system to be inoperable. While some items are covered under warranty, some are not. Labor was not covered. The cost to bring the unit back in service was \$ 2,711.60. We applied the balance from the parking lot funds to pay this invoice. The total remaining parking lot fund is now \$ 1,381.36.
- b. East Side Original unit from 1993. The system is completely inoperable and not in use. Estimated costs provided by the contractor are over 50% of the new system. That cost may even go higher as they begin working on the unit. In a joint agreement with the consistory and finance committee, we advised the contractor to do no work on the current unit and submit a quote for a replacement unit. We are now waiting for that quote.

Summary – We will try to keep the sanctuary comfortable with running the one unit. So, we ask for understanding while we work through this situation. Also, we ask for your financial support in acquiring the funds for a replacement unit. When we obtain the quote, we will share that with you. Depending on the level of financial support, that will determine the timeline on how soon the new system can be installed. We will also apply the parking lot fund balance (\$ 1,381.36) toward the new unit. Your gift(s) can be made Online by selecting "Fund Drive" then simply note as Sanctuary A/C. Or place in weekly offering plate with envelope noted as "Fund Drive" – Sanctuary A/C. Thank You for your support.
