Grace and Peace Beloved of God.

As the year presses on, communities are adapting to new norms. These changes have heightened anxieties and concerns about the ways we maintain connections and the sense of community that many have felt. Many of us are experiencing a loss. We should acknowledge the grief, frustration, and uncertainty that we are navigating. The globe is wrestling with the COVID-19 pandemic, a reckoning concerning racial disparities and inequities, and our nation is grappling with partisan divides that remain wide and deep.

We have worked to respond to the pain around us. For those suffering from disasters, we have rallied and contributed funds for those in Lebanon, lowa, and California, to name a few. We continue to help local families as the needs surface. We are adapting our presence in worship for the well-being of the community. The time that we are enduring reminds me of the hardships the Hebrew people experienced in the wilderness.

God had Moses instruct the people to make an ark of acacia wood. (Exodus 25:10-22) This ark was to be a symbol of God's continual presence with them, no matter where they traveled. Exodus 25:22 reads, "There, above the cover between the two cherubim that are over the ark of the covenant law, I will meet with you and give you all my commands for the Israelites. God is so caring that God continually kept the covenant, even when the life that the people knew was turned upside down.

God had Moses bring together the designers and artists to work with the priests to fashion something mobile, something new. No longer were the people of God to meet in the familiar setting of

the temple. God spoke to the people that in their time of upheaval, they were to adapt to their circumstances. And the God of Moses kept the promise to be with them in their wandering. God is faithful. In the wilderness then and in our wilderness on this day, God says I will accompany you and I will be with you, among you. God was not in the ark. God's glory is our sanctuary. God goes with us, goes before us, and keeps watch behind and over us.

God provides the strength and the instruction for us to be faithful, to love God, and obey God's commands to love and care for one another, as God cares for us. Hold on during this time of upheaval. We are in prayer concerning our return to the physical sanctuary and have your health and safety at heart. Be of good cheer, be encouraged, and stay faithful. God is doing something new in the land and is calling us to adapt, be steadfast in our commitments, and to be kind to strangers and friends. This world is hurting and needs change agents like you to demonstrate patience and resilience as ambassadors of Christ.

The cash receipt and expenditure activity for the period August 1 thru August 31, 2020 is attached. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelope. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e salaries, utililities, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is refering to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the santuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card program is another

way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaing a Giant Gift Card. The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our commitments.
